- The clues can be entered in Google then it's up to you to sort it out. You have also been given the country in which to find the property and most of them are within National Trust Guides.
- Make sure the place you are visiting is Open.
- Check to see if there are toilets, some of the smaller properties have not.
- Most of them have walks, where you can take dogs on leads, but always check.
- There are events at a number of sites, so whatever your interest, it would be worthwhile checking.
